| Successes | The first Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council water refill station was operational in June 2021. New Water Refill Since then, a further 9 taps have been added. The ten sites have a broad geographical spread within the council area, covering Lisburn, Dundonald, Moira and Carryduff. Additional sites will be added when facilities are upgraded or when suitable locations can be identified. |
| Communication | A dedicated water bottle refill section was put on the LCCC website so these locations could be easily found by visitors to the council facilities. The webpage also includes a direction finder linked to google or iOS maps and images of each location. Click here to view. The taps are promoted each year during themed days or weeks such as Refill Day, Zero Waste Week and European Week for Waste Reduction. Prizes are offered to users who check their nearest refill station and submit their entry on social media or to a competition email address. These competitions are very popular and get hundreds of entries each time. |
